

Besting

Thank you very much to all those who supported Fr Joyzy last week as he discussed his new position as Director of the Psycho-Spiritual Institute in Kenya, you raised \$510 so far. Thank you also for responding to our own parishioner Dr. Raymond Chimezie, PhD, CHES® as we form a committee to consider how we can continue to support his ongoing ministry in Nigeria through the Health for Schools and Communities Foundation. There are many local, national and international needs, but having close connections to these needs reassures us that every gift and sacrifice we make is being put to good use.

We are contemplating chapter 6 of the Gospel of John for five Sundays in a row, from the 17th to the 21st Sundays of Ordinary Time. This includes the Bread of Life discourse and John's theology of the Eucharist. This weekend we are in the middle of this chapter trying to understand why Jesus calls himself "the bread that came down from heaven" (JN 6:41). This teaching is essential to how we practice our Catholic Faith, and we should not take our understanding of the Eucharist for granted. In fact many Catholics have doubts about this sacrament as did the people who heard our Lord's teaching when he explained it himself for the first time. If we do not immerse ourselves in this teaching and refuse to believe in what our Lord is telling us we risk becoming antichrists as we will hear at the end of this discourse: "As a result of this (teaching), many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him" (JN 6:66).

Wednesday, August 15th, is a Holy Day of Obligation as we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Masses at 8:15 a.m. & 6:30 p.m. (confessions 5:30 p.m.) **Fr John Direen, Pastor**

Professor Rabbi Daniel Sperber studied for rabbinic ordination at Yeshivot Kol Torah in Israel, earned a Bachelors degree in Art History from the Courtauld Institute of Art , and a doctorate from University College, London in Classics, Ancient History and Hebrew Studies. In 1968 he joined the faculty of Bar-Ilan University, as a teacher in the Talmud department. For the past eight years, he has served as President of the Jesselson Institute for Advanced Torah Studies. For two decades he has served as a representative of the Israel Ministry of Religion and the Foreign Office in matters of interreligious dialogue.

Reverend Monsignor Guy Massie serves as the chairperson and Vicar for Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs for the Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn. He is also the pastor at Sacred Hearts and St. Stephen Church in Brooklyn. Massie received his master's degree in Judaic Studies at the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, and the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington.

At the event, you will be provided materials to celebrate this historic milestone with your parishes and congregations on a community-wide Sabbath of Celebration on November 16-18. We will also be matching interested Rabbis and Priests to participate in a pulpit exchange on this weekend.
