**Professor Rabbi Daniel Sperber** studied for rabbinic ordination at Yeshivot Kol Torah in Israel, earned a Bachelors degree in Art History from the Courtauld Institute of Art , and a doctorate from University College, London in Classics, Ancient History and Hebrew Studies. In 1968 he joined the faculty of Bar-Ilan University, as a teacher in the Talmud department. For the past eight years, he has served as President of the Jesselson Institute for Advanced Torah Studies. For two decades he has served as a representative of the Israel Ministry of Religion and the Foreign Office in matters of interreligious dialogue.

**Reverend Monsignor Guy Massie** serves as the chairperson and Vicar for Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs for the Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn. He is also the pastor at Sacred Hearts and St. Stephen Church in Brooklyn. Massie received his master's degree in Judaic Studies at the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, and the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington.
