The New Church Year begins this weekend, and for the next twelve months our Scripture texts in the Hvmnals are under headings "Sunday C" and "Weekday 1". During the Penitential Season of Advent, the Kyrie becomes more prominent as we set aside the Gloria except for feast days (Dec 8 Solemnity Immaculate Conception, Dec 12 Feast Our Lady of Guadalupe).

The First Sunday of Advent begins a new liturgical year and a new cycle of readings from our lectionary. We will meditate primarily on the Gospel according to St. Luke this year (Year C), and we begin with an exhortation from our Lord Jesus Christ to live Advent year round: "Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man" (LK 21:36). To escape the tribulations does not mean that we can avoid them, rather as we encounter them we need strength not to succumb. Standing before the Son of Man we will encounter the ultimate power, which has already won victory over sin and death. The temptations and threats we face every day give us the opportunity to demonstrate the power of Christ already at work in us, but we must be vigilant about submitting to Christ in every way, confessing our sins and seeking his mercy so that he can reign in our lives forever. As we prepare for Christmas we ask our Lord to increase our anticipation for his return in glory.

We reached our 2018 Bishop Appeal goal of \$13,500. The Austria family donated \$4,500 in memory of Ray Austria who passed away on November 10th, may he rest in peace. Thank you very much to the Austria family and to all who contributed to this year's Bishop Appeal.
