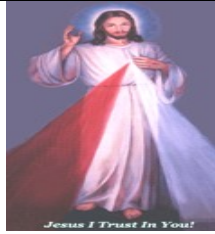

Pastor's COLUMN

"Peace be with you" (JN 20:19) were the first words our Risen Lord spoke to the apostles. The evangelist then gives to us in the next verse what is true 20:20 vision: "The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord." The gospel on this Divine Mercy Sunday, the 8th day of the Octave of Easter, demonstrates our Lord's purpose in becoming human and suffering his passion. It is to give us peace. He does not want to condemn us, he wants to restore us to full harmony with the Most Holy Trinity. The world cannot offer us anything like it.

Throughout the Easter season our First Reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles. We contemplate how they respond to the gift of the Holy Spirit our Lord breaths on them. They spend the rest of their lives engaged in corporal and spiritual works of mercy. They share the peace of Christ with everyone they meet by serving their needs and proclaiming the Good News of our Lord's resurrection. They see Christ in their ministry.

Our vision improves the more we follow their example and share in the same gift of the Holy Spirit. We feel the peace of Christ when we are present to the needs of others as our Lord is present to our needs. We also rejoice as we see more clearly the Risen Lord in those we serve. May God give us the holy desire to rejoice always.
