

"Brothers and sisters: For freedom Christ set us free: so stand firm and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery. For you were called for freedom, brothers and sisters. But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh; rather, serve one another through love." (Gal 5:1,13) Our second reading this 13th Sunday of Ordinary Time reminds us that with freedom comes responsibility.
